Petitions will be accepted in the Office of Admissions and Records through Thursday, March 21, 2013.

Below you will find our Catalog information on Degrees, Certificates and Graduation.

Petitioning for a Degree or Certificate

In order to receive a Degree and/or Certificate from Solano Community College you must file a completed "Petition for Degree or Certificate" with the Office of Admissions and Records during the appropriate time frame. It is recommended that you meet with your counselor each term that you are in attendance at SCC to ensure that you are meeting the necessary requirements.

In your last semester of attendance, you should submit your completed "Petition for Degree or Certificate" to the Office of Admissions and Records. Petitions are accepted beginning the first day of each term through a date that is set and published for each term.

NO PETITIONS ARE ACCEPTED AFTER THE DEADLINE.

Please check Dates and Deadlines in MySolano for the deadline.

Petitions are typically reviewed by Admissions and Records and students are notified of the outcome 2-4 months after the term ends.

2. Test Day: Arrive On Time w/Photo ID

- → Doors Open @ 9am, 1pm or 5pm (See schedule above).
- → Please have your photo ID and SCC ID number available.
- → Reading, Sentence Skills & Math Tests = 30 minutes each.
- → All tests are multiple choice. You may take more/less time.

3. Test Day: Print Your Test Scores

- → Upon completing your tests, print your test scores 1 time. Scroll to the bottom of the screen and CLICK PRINT. Your scores print out in the front office area.
- → Close your computer window and recycle your scratch paper in our recycle box.
- → Meet us up front for a printed copy and an explanation of your Assessment Test Scores.
- → Retain your copy of your Assessment Test Scores for your personal records.
- → IF YOU NEED HELP WHILE TESTING: Or, if you have questions, please raise your hand.

Planned Parenthood Express Clinics We will be serving students every Wednesday from 12:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Student Health Center in Room 1409. All services are confidential. Services include: birth control (Nuva ring, patch, pills), HIV screening test, STD testing, free pregnancy testing, free condoms & emergency contraception.

Tuberculin (TB) Skin Testing is offered by appointment, Mondays & Tuesdays 10:00 a.m. to noon, Monday, 4:00-5:00 p.m., and Tuesday, 5:00-6:00 p.m. You must return in 48-72 hours post test to have the Tuberculin skin test read and receive your record of testing.

Health Screening exams are available at the Student Health Center for Children's Program students. Drop-in or make an appointment for your Health Screening.

Screenings/testing: Health, diabetic, vision, hearing and urine screenings, are free to students.

W hat is the Out of the Darkness Campus Walk?

Out of the Darkness Campus Walks are a day to remember those lost to suicide, create awareness to those struggling with mood disorders and bring hope to survivors of suicide. Throughout the year, teams of friends, families and students gather on their school campuses to raise funds for research, education and support services for suicide prevention.

On Walk day, we gather in cities and towns across America. Walking, in memory and support, holding signs, wearing pictures, creating awareness. More than a walk, the day includes support, sharing, music and more.

American Foundation for Suicide Prevention Information

AFSP is the leading non-profit organization exclusively dedicated to understanding and preventing suicide through research, education and advocacy and to reaching out to people with mental disorders and those impacted by suicide.

Since 2000, AFSP has given grant support totaling over \$10 million to scientists throughout the country and abroad for studies on neurobiological, genetic, epidemiological, clinical, psychological and sociological aspects of suicide. Since 2001, more than 95 percent of AFSP grantees have received further funding from public and paids escures to continue their research. This shows that AFSP-funded research is making an impact, and is attracting young investigators to the
